Our horses are now fully settled into our new Second Chance Ranch location, just a mile away from the ARL's Main campus, and in early February we celebrated our first adoption at the new ranch – a mustang named Salmon (right) who is loving his new home and is now in training as a 4-H horse!



Several more horses have also found homes, and those still in our care are enjoying a spacious new paddock area, renovated housing, and a renovated indoor arena.

Work on the new ranch is continuing, and we can't wait for the horses and other barn animals to experience the future improvements your support will make possible. One of our next big steps will be installing new pasture fencing that will allow our horses to graze - something the new ranch location makes possible for the first time! Phase 2 of the project, creating a Rescue Intake & Rehabilitation Center for large-scale rescues of all species, is set to kick off this year.

You gave hope to 53 pets



Your support provides rescue, healing and hope for animals in even the most desperate situations. Thanks to you, in January we were able to be there for 52 cats and a dog, all crammed in a small hotel room in urgent need of help.

When ARL Animal Services officers arrived, the smell of urine hit them immediately. The room was filled with trash, feces, and so many cats. They were hiding everywhere, tucked into small spaces under the bed and between piles of trash and clothing. Some were just tiny kittens who had never known life outside of these horrible conditions.

At the shelter, our Miracle Medical Team found many of the cats were suffering from flea and ear mite infestations, and nearly all showed symptoms of

upper respiratory infections. The young kittens were underweight and anemic as a result of their flea infestations. They had a long road to recovery, but you were there for them every step of the way.

In the following weeks, with your support, our medical team treated the cats and kittens for their illnesses. We're happy to say that as of early April most of the animals from this rescue have found new families! The handful remaining in our care are continuing to heal, and we hope they'll be ready for adoption soon.
